Meet Kylie our 94th award recipient

Kylie was 24 years old, and had suffered with anorexia for two years. She was making her second attempt at residential treatment and wrote about wanting to live her life to the fullest.

She recently shared her journey and where life has taken her since November 2021.



“March of 2024 will be two years since I’ve gotten out of treatment. Since then I’ve gotten my associates degree in pre-professional studies. Currently I’m working towards a bachelor in psychology with a minor in human development and family studies. I’m working towards becoming a counselor or therapist someday.

Since I’ve gotten out of treatment I’ve really learned to accept that recovery isn’t linear and I’ve learned to work with my team to adapt my recovery to my lifestyle. I’ve come to have a good relationship with myself and be honest with those close to me when I am triggered and need extra support.

Going to treatment not only saved my life but allowed me to gain a new perspective.”

Health Class Presentations to 628 Students!!!

When Jennifer began full recovery, she shared her story by giving a presentation to high school students, and we continue to follow her example to this day.

Why high schools?

- **11%** of high school students suffer with an eating disorder; this increases to **13%** for college students
- **12%** of adolescent girls have some form of eating disorder

DID YOU KNOW THAT IN THE UNITED STATES

- **28.8 million** Americans will have an eating disorder in their lifetime
- Only **35-40%** of people with anorexia or bulimia receive treatment
- Inpatient treatment typically costs up to **\$60,000** for a 30 day program
- **10%** of people with anorexia nervosa die from complications
- **10,200** deaths per year as a direct result of an eating disorder
- That equates to **1 death every 52 minutes**
